

## STOPOVER

When you use verbs to talk about the weather, pay attention to the verb form:

- If you are talking about the **current weather**, use the **present continuous**: *It's raining outside.*
- If you are talking about the **usual weather** in some place, use the **present simple**: *It often rains in London in the wintertime.*

## STOPOVER

### Celsius and Fahrenheit

In the US, the temperatures are shown in Fahrenheit. This is how you can quickly find out what the temperature (approximately) is:

**From Fahrenheit to Celsius:** *Subtract thirty and divide by two*

**From Celsius to Fahrenheit:** *Double it and add thirty*

<b>approximately</b>	noin, suurin piirtein	<b>subtract</b>	vähentää

<b>add</b>	lisätä	<b>by two</b>	kahdella
